- Consider dining out or "paper plating" it for a little while. You may appreciate your microwave more than before!
- Seal off doorways leading to the living areas of the home. This simple step can help control the inevitable dust created and keep your sanity.
- The garage may need to be utilized for staging of cabinets prior to installation. It also will need to be used as a temporary "shop" to cut parts for the installation. Plan to be without use of the garage for a few days.
